Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric

Note: There is no L fabric.

Fabrics A-D, cut from each:

(3) 7" (17.78cm) squares on point

Fabric E, cut:

(2) 7" (17.78cm) squares on point

Fabric F, cut:

(12) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF (3.81cm x WOF); sub-cut (28) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7" (3.81cm x 17.78cm), and (28) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9" (3.81cm x 22.86cm)

Enough $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (6.35cm) bias strips to make 320" (8.13m) finished binding

Fabrics G-I, cut from each:

Fussy-cut (6) 7" (17.78cm) squares with flowers; cut each square once diagonally to make (12) triangles

Fabric J, cut:

Fussy-cut (6) 7" (17.78cm) squares with flowers; cut each square once diagonally to make (12) triangles

(14) 4½" (11.43cm) squares, centering a blue/green sunburst flower

Fabric K, cut:

Fussy-cut (4) 7" (17.78cm) squares with flowers; cut each square once diagonally to make (8) triangles

(14) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (11.43cm) squares, centering a pink sunburst flower

Fabrics M-Z, cut from each:

(1) 4½" x WOF (11.43cm x WOF); sub-cut (7) 4½"

(11.43cm) squares

Fabric AA, cut:

(2) 4½" x WOF (11.43cm x WOF); sub-cut (6) 4½" x 12½" (11.43cm x 31.75cm)

Fabrics BB-KK, cut from each:

(1) 4½" x WOF (11.43cm x WOF); sub-cut (3) 4½" x 12½" (11.43cm x 31.75cm)

Fabric LL-NN, cut from each:


(1) 4½" x WOF (11.43cm x WOF); sub-cut (2) 4½" x 12½" (11.43cm x 31.75cm)

Sewing


All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " (.64cm) and pieces are sewn right sides together. Note that there is no **L** fabric.


Block 1

With the 7" (17.78cm) Fabric A square design facing upright, sew (1) 1½" x 7" (3.81cm x 17.78cm) Fabric F strip to opposite edges. Press the seams toward Fabric A. Sew (1) 1½" x 9" (3.81cm x 22.86cm) Fabric F strip to each of the two remaining edges and press the seams toward Fabric A (Fig. 1).



2. Sew (1) Fabric G triangle to opposite edges of the Fabric A/F block and press the seams toward the triangles. Sew a matching triangle on the opposite sides of the unit and press seams toward the triangles (Fig. 2). The finished block should measure 12½" (31.75cm) square (Fig. 3).













- 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make a total of (3) matching
- **4.** Repeat Steps 1-2 to make a total of (3) blocks of each of the following fabric combinations: B/F/H (**Fig. 4**); C/F/I (**Fig. 5**); and D/F/J (**Fig. 6**)








5. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make a total of (2) E/F/K blocks (**Fig. 7**).



Block 2


- 6. Select (1) 4½" (11.43cm) Fabric J and K square, and (1) 4½" (11.43cm) square from each of Fabrics M-S. Arrange the squares in a pleasing order to form the 9-patch shown in Figure 8.
- 7. Sew the squares together in each row and press the seams in alternate directions for adjacent rows (Fig. 9).









- Sew the rows together in order, matching adjacent seams.
- Repeat Steps 6-8 to make a total of (7) blocks using Fabrics J, K, and M-S, randomly shuffle the placement of fabrics from block to block.
- **10.** Repeat Steps 6-9 using **Fabrics J, K** and **T-Z**. Make a total of (7) assorted blocks (**Fig. 10**).




Block 3


11. Select (1) 4½" x 12½" (11.43cm x 31.75cm) strip of Fabrics AA, BB, and CC. Arrange the strips as shown in Figure 11-12.






- **12.** Sew the long edges of the strips together and press the seams in one direction. Repeat to make a total of (3) blocks using **Fabrics AA**, **BB**, and **CC**, randomly shuffling the fabric placement from block to block.
- **13.** Repeat Steps 11-12 to make (3) blocks each from the following fabric combinations: AA/DD/EE (**Fig. 13**); FF/GG/HH (**Fig. 14**); and II/JJ/KK (**Fig. 15**).












14. Repeat Steps 11-12 using Fabrics LL, MM, and NN. Make a total of (2) assorted blocks (Fig. 16).



Quilt Top Assembly

- 15. Lay out the blocks in (7) rows of (6) blocks each as shown in the Quilt Layout. Don't worry if your colors are in different locations within a block as the patterning can be random.
- **16.** Sew the blocks together in each row and number the rows. Press seams in alternating directions for adjacent blocks.
- 17. Sew the rows together in numerical order, matching adjacent seams.

Finishing

- 18. Sew together the 2½" (6.35cm) Fabric F bias binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- 19. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
- 20. Leaving an 8" (20.32cm) tail of binding, sew binding to top of guilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" (30.48cm) from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to 1/4" (.64cm) and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
- 21. Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
